It concludes with ideas to turn your research into a project that can be shared with others.

This book has been heavily revised and expanded from the original "Researching Your U.S. WWI Army Ancestors" to include information about researching service members in the U.S. Navy, the U.S. Marine Corps, the U.S. Coast Guard and the Merchant Marine and along with civilian noncombatants who went overseas to support the troops. The strategies presented can also be used in larger projects to research a military organization.
